Christian Ministry Courses

Commencing 26 February 2011

The Big Picture

(1 1/2 credit hours)

Sixty-six books written by forty people over nearly 2,000 years, in two languages and spanning several different literary genres—that's God's Word! What ties it all together? This study focuses on the over-arching vision of God's mission in the world and how human beings are called to respond. Each book will be placed in its cultural and historical setting as we focus on its distinctive contribution.

Calling and Foundation of Ministry

(1 credit hour)

This course addresses issues such as: What is the meaning of calling? What are the different aspects of a calling? How do we live out our calling as disciples of Jesus Christ?

Local Church and Missions

(1/2 credit hour)

An introduction to the study of the mission of the Christian church, with a particular focus on the central role of the church.

Apologetics

(1 credit hour)

A course designed to present the philosophical and factual evidence which support the validity and divine origin of the Christian faith and its doctrines and to build a positive Christian world and life view.

Personality Theories

(1 credit hour)

Overview of major personality theories with regard to their development, philosophical assumptions, theoretical concepts and their clinical implications in work with individuals. Students are encouraged to take a reflective and critically interactive perspective to evaluating each theory.

Ethics & Contemporary Issues

(1/2 credit hour)

A study of contemporary ethical issues from a Biblical perspective. Issues such as divorce, remarriage, homosexuality, abortion and euthanasia will be discussed.

Christian Ministry Courses

Commencing 23 July 2011

Understanding God

(1 credit hour)

A study into understanding of the nature of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit as well as the nature of man.

Biblical Interpretation

(1 credit hour)

A study of the methods and interpretative principles involved in discerning the meaning of the biblical text. Students learn to use the standard tools for biblical study

Communicating for a Change

(1 credit hour)

This course will offer unique strategies for communicators seeking to deliver captivating and practical messages

What Other's Believe

(1 credit hour)

This course will explore the origins, core beliefs and practices of Islam, Buddhism, traditional Chinese Religions and Hinduism and present a Christian response to each of these.

Foundational Perspectives of Christian Counseling

(1/2 credit hour)

A foundational course which focuses on the integration of psychology and theology, the nature and approaches of Christian counseling

Therapeutic Relationship

(1 credit hour)

This course introduces the student to the therapeutic process of a counseling relationship. Emphasis is placed on acquiring the basic empathic skills.

Group Dynamics

(1 credit hour)

This experiential course is necessary in preparation for people helping. This course gives you the opportunity to become aware of who you are, your strengths and limitations that you bring into your interpersonal relationships.

Human and Spiritual Development

(1 credit hour)

This course will study stages of faith, faith and personality development. This course will look at discernment tools, noticing interior movements and helping another to grow in discernment
